



Stewart Conn was born in Glasgow in 1936. Married with two sons he has for many years lived in Edinburgh, and is currently the capital's first poet laureate. Formerly head of radio drama for BBC Scotland, one of his last productions won a gold medal award at the 1991 New York Radio Festival. As a poet and playwright he has received Scottish Arts Council, Society of Authors and other awards, and been a Poetry Book Society Choice.

Publications include *Distances: a personal evocation of people and places* (Scottish Cultural Press) and *Stolen Light: Selected Poems*, published by Bloodaxe from whom *Ghosts at Cockcrow* is due next spring. He has read at the Edinburgh International Book Festival and the Festival franco-anglais de poésie in Paris, and in the British Museum's millennium season.
