

Nikica Petrak was born 1939 in Duga Resa. He earned his degree in English and History of Arts at the Zagreb University. With the Herder grant he spent a year in Vienna. On return he got a job as an editor, first in the publishing sector and then on the national TV. He was working as an editor at the Lexicographic Institute Miroslav Krleža. Petrak is prolific translator from English and German, mostly political science, and cultural books and plays, as well. Some of his translations are: *On Tyranny* by L. Strauss, *Origin of Knowledge and Imagination* by J. Bronowsky, *Cultural History of Greece* by E. Friedell, *On Violence* by H. Arendt.

More than once a national literary prize holder and also adorned with the prestigious poetry prize, *Goranov vijenac* (1996). Petrak is member of the Croatian Academy of Science and Arts (HAZU).
