

Riccardo Held was born 1954 in Venice. He earned his degree in French literature, and later translated a number of works of classical authors such as, J. Racine, H. de Balzac, V. Hugo, and G. Flaubert. He translates from German too; his translations of R.M. Rilke and G. Benn were published in Italian.

Until 1996 he was editor in chief for international fiction in the publishing house Marsilo (Venice), and he started the edition "Marsilio – Poesia". For Mondadori edition "Meridians" he has edited works of P. Celan, T Mann and R. Musil.

He received Pasolini-Rimini Literary Prize for the book of poetry, *Per questa rilassata acida voglia* (1985) and the Montale Prize for the book of poetry, *Il guizzo irriverente dell'azzuro* (1996).

His poems were translated in French, German, Spain and English language.
