

Tahar Ben Jelloun was born 1944 in Fez, Morocco. He earned his degree in philosophy at the Mohammad V University in Rabat. After that he was teaching philosophy in Tetuan and Casablanca. He left for France in 1971 for postgraduate study in social psychology, and earned his PhD in 1975. Currently he is working as psychotherapists.

Tahar Ben Jelloun is prolific author, published a number of books of poetry and fiction. He writes essays and plays commenting on the themes such as racism and intolerance. Ben Jelloun is internationally renowned author; his works were translated in different languages. He won Goncur Prize for 1987 with the novel, *La nuit sacrée*.
