



Lela B. Njatin, born 1963 in Ljubljana, Slovenia, has earned her degree in comparative literature and philosophy, worked as an editor for culture at newspaper and councilor for public relations in science. She was cofounder and president of Trubar Foundation for publishing books by Slovenian authors in foreign countries, cofounder and manager of Slovenian Center for Literature Exchange, a member of presiding board at Slovenian Writers Association; she founded and run School for creative writing in Piran, and Temporary Foreign Writers Residence in Kočevje. She was a member of the board of magazine *Literatura* and *Litterae Slovenicae* as well as in publishing house Aleph.

She was an executive producer of the Weeks of Slovenian culture in Brussels and Salzburg, promoted Slovenian visual and theatre artists and took part in Committee for Free Lance Artists at Slovenian Ministry for Culture. She translates from English and German. Her short stories were included in anthologies of Slovenian literature and published in Slovenia and abroad.
